

Registration

Students are required to follow up *on-line* to determine if their registration has been approved. No candidate may be registered at the U.W.I. in more than one programme at the same time.

Proof of payment should be submitted to the programme office before books and materials are issued.

Application Forms

Applicants are required to pay an application processing fee of **J\$250.00/ BDS\$15.00/ TT\$45.00 or US\$30.00**. The receipt should be submitted along with the completed application forms.

Where written examinations are scheduled for a given course, students will be informed by the office, of the relevant examination dates, times and sites in their location.

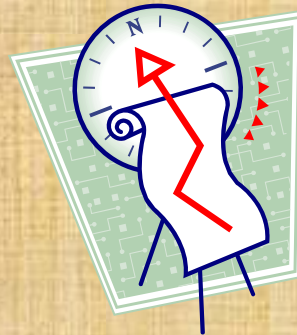
A student who fails 50 percent or more of the courses taken during the academic year or who fails a course twice will be asked to withdraw from the programme.



Fees

The Master of Education in Educational Measurement is offered via the Summer & On-Line Programme Office in the School of Education. This programme is self-financed and fees are subject to change at the beginning of each academic year.

For new entrants to the programme in January 2008, the overall programme cost is **US\$7500** so long as steady progress is achieved through consecutive academic periods as scheduled. However repeated courses and / or resit examinations attract additional fees.

Master of Education in Educational Measurement

Within the Caribbean, there is a dearth of properly trained educational measurement specialists to satisfy institutional needs of programmes being implemented nationally and regionally. This programme is designed to respond to these needs.



Aims and Objectives of the Programme

The programme is designed to prepare participants who will be able to:

- design instruments that satisfy the technical requirements of educational and psychological measurement;
- conduct data analysis and prepare relevant reports on the quality of educational and psychological tests;
- advise on various types of tests, items and question that are appropriate for the intended purpose;
- apply the skills of educational and psychological measurement to monitor development and change in the education sector;
- design and conduct research in the field of educational and psychological measurement and prepare relevant reports to guide decision making or to add to the understanding of educational phenomena.



Entry Requirements

Candidates for admission must qualify under the general university regulations for a postgraduate diploma and a master's degree:

- A first degree at or above the Lower Second Honours Levels; or a grade point average equivalent to a B or above; AND
- A professional qualification in teaching such as a postgraduate diploma or certificate, or an approved equivalent. Full documentation of the applicant's academic record and referees' reports must be submitted to the Office of Graduate Studies and Research, Mona.

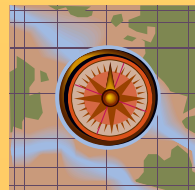
OR

Five years of experience in a position in teaching; curriculum development, educational administration or educational measurement

- *Additionally, applicants must be computer literate, be familiar with the Internet and own an e-mail address - preferably Yahoo!.*

Equivalents

- Applicants with a UWI B.Ed. degree gained before the honours classifications were introduced (between 1970 and 1985), must have a minimum of B grade average. Applicants who graduated before 1970 must have a minimum of B in their research study.



Programme Structure

To fulfil the requirements of the degree of Master of Education with specialization in Educational Measurement, students are required to complete eight taught courses and a research project. This programme consists of thirty-six (36) credits comprised as set out below.

Courses

The following six courses, for three credits each, are compulsory for all students:

- Introduction to Educational Research
- Introduction to Quantitative Methods
- Fundamentals of Data Analysis
- Introduction to Educational and Psychological Measurement
- Advanced Educational and Psychological Measurement
- Issues in Internal Assessment

Two additional courses selected from those below, for three credits each, in a combination that is in keeping with the interest of the individual student:

- Social Psychology and its Implications for Education
- Measurement of Psychological and Educational Constructs
- Cognition and Learning
- Curriculum Evaluation
